

Founded in 1985, the Scottish Vintage Bus Museum is situated at Lathalmond, a former Royal Navy stores depot.


The 45 acre site includes an internal road system, exhibition hall, workshops and storage sheds, and is also home to the Shed47 Railway Restoration Group.
